Now, after a very wet winter, we are at last starting to see an improvement in the weather. Despite all the rain however, volunteers have been carrying on throughout the last three months working towards the development of the Waldersea site. Work on the Victorian carriage continues, also ground clearance work for the further extension of the siding under construction, and, the arrival of a box van body kindly donated by Antingham Parish council, has all been going on since our last newsletter. The grounded body from Antingham, in Norfolk, as well as being in keeping with part of the era of the lines operation, will serve as a very useful store facility for basic materials used by our volunteers. It arrived on a hiab crane lorry on the 30<sup>th</sup> December, enabling our members to get it safely positioned during the Christmas period. The transport was very kindly arranged and financed by Roger Gregory of the Mid Suffolk Light Railway.

### **Latest News.**

Local MP, Stephen Barclay held a 'summit' meeting on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> March in the House of Commons, to further the growing local impetus to reopen the Wisbech-March Bramley line.

Widely reported on the local news channels, the meeting was scheduled to include the Minister of Transport, Stephen Hammond, with representatives from Network Rail, the Atkins Rail Consultancy, train operator Greater Anglia, the leader of Cambridgeshire County Council, and the leader of Fenland District council, along with various other rail experts.

The Chief Executive of the Local Enterprise Partnership, also attending, has responsibility over the Regional Growth Fund, which is often used to fund such ventures. Any actual funding allocation is in turn determined by a committee headed by Lord Heseltine and the cabinet office minister, Greg Clark MP.

There is no doubt that the Bramley line Trust has done a great deal to keep this eight mile line alive in the mind of the local community over recent years since the last train ran over the track. It will continue to do so irrespective of the inevitable lengthy discussions, negotiations, hopes, promises, set backs etc., that go hand in hand with any potential large spend project of this kind. The local economics are being shown and agreed by most parties, including now local government, to prove the case, that reopening the line is a commercial proposition, and would inevitably be a great boost for Wisbech.

We will continue to support this initiative, running side by side with our own goals to establish a heritage rail link, and heritage museum centre with the further development of Waldersea.






